

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Word Study: Unit 22</u> spelling – compound words vocabulary – planning a trip</p>

This week we will be studying compound words. A compound word is a word made up of two or more shorter words. For example:

birth + day = birthday

any + one = anyone

Caution: Students sometimes forget that a compound word must be made up of two complete words rather than two sounds or syllables. Keep this in mind so as not to misidentify a multisyllabic word as a compound word.

Students should study the 18 assigned words below. They will be tested on all of them this Friday.
