Bees are very important. They make honey and help **crops** to grow. There are many kinds of bees. One kind is **gentle**, but it does not work hard. Another kind of bee is very **mean**, but it is a hard worker. This bee makes much more honey than the gentle bee. One man thought that **mating** these two bees would be a good idea. He thought **crossing** the two kinds of bees would make a gentle, hard-working bee. That was a big mistake.

Crossing the two kinds of bees **produced** a new bee. This bee is known as the killer bee. The killer

bee is **dangerous**. It gets upset easily. Just a **sudden** noise can upset this bee. Then it may attack and sting.

One sting from a killer bee is not enough to kill a person. But when this bee stings, it leaves its **guts** with its stinger. Other killer bees can smell the guts left behind. They **chase** the person. Thousands of killer bees will chase one person. Many people have been killed by these bees. No wonder people are afraid of a **swarm** of killer bees!
