Such a **situation** might have happened in 16th-**century** England.

Laws there said how people could dress, right down to the buttons! All people could wear wool. All could wear brown. Few could wear silk. Even fewer could wear purple. People who didn't follow dress **codes** could be fined or arrested.

What was the **purpose** of these laws? England's **rulers** wrote them to help guard **industry** and wealth. Many fine **fabrics** came only from faraway

lands. Dress codes pushed people to buy fabrics made in England. They also stopped **common people** from buying things they couldn't afford. They helped guard the **nobles' status** too. Rulers didn't think common people should dress better than nobles. And no one should dress like one of the king's family!

Dress codes were important for a time. But they were hard to **enforce**. Over time, such laws died out. Purplelovers in England can rest easy—it is now **legal** to wear the color!
