

The **majestic** kapok tree stands tall over other trees in the forest. In **Mayan myths**, this tree is known as the "tree of life." It has been an important **symbol** in Mayan **culture**.

The kapok tree has been important to other people too. The fruit of the kapok tree has many useful **qualities**. This fruit is a **pod** filled with **fluff**. The fluff is also called kapok. Kapok keeps its shape over time. It holds in heat and **muffles** sound. These qualities make it good for **stuffing** things. In the early 1900s, kapok was often used to stuff

beds, pillows, and stuffed animals. At that time, even baseballs were filled with kapok!

Kapok has another useful quality. It floats! It is light and **repels** water. People found that it made good stuffing for **life jackets**. Until the end of the **Second World War**, most life jackets were stuffed with kapok. Kapok likely saved many sailors' lives. Maybe these sailors didn't know about Mayan myths. Yet for them, the kapok was also a tree of life!

Parent Tips
